Therefore, junior members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with any official or coach of **Tynedale Cricket Club** or **Chris Fletcher** the Child Welfare Officer.

As a junior member of **Tynedale Cricket Club** you are expected to abide by the following code of conduct:

- You must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions
- You must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion
- You should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late
- You must wear suitable kit for training and match sessions, as agreed with the coach/team manager
- You are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions
- You are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club
